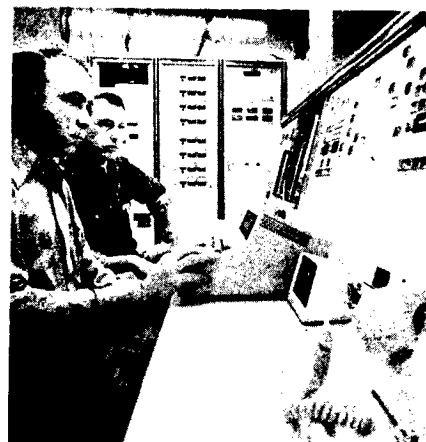

"We have replanted almost the entire area not occupied by the buildings with the native grass that covers the hillsides," says Ed Robinson, the station's operations supervisor. "We have even silenced all of the air intakes and other valves," he says.



ALL functions of new earth station can be handled from control room.

Great thought was given, also, to making the station reliable.

"We have a second antenna purely for backup and maintenance testing," Robinson says. "And we have a pretty sophisticated backup power system that will keep the station in operation even if commercial power to this rather remote location should be interrupted.

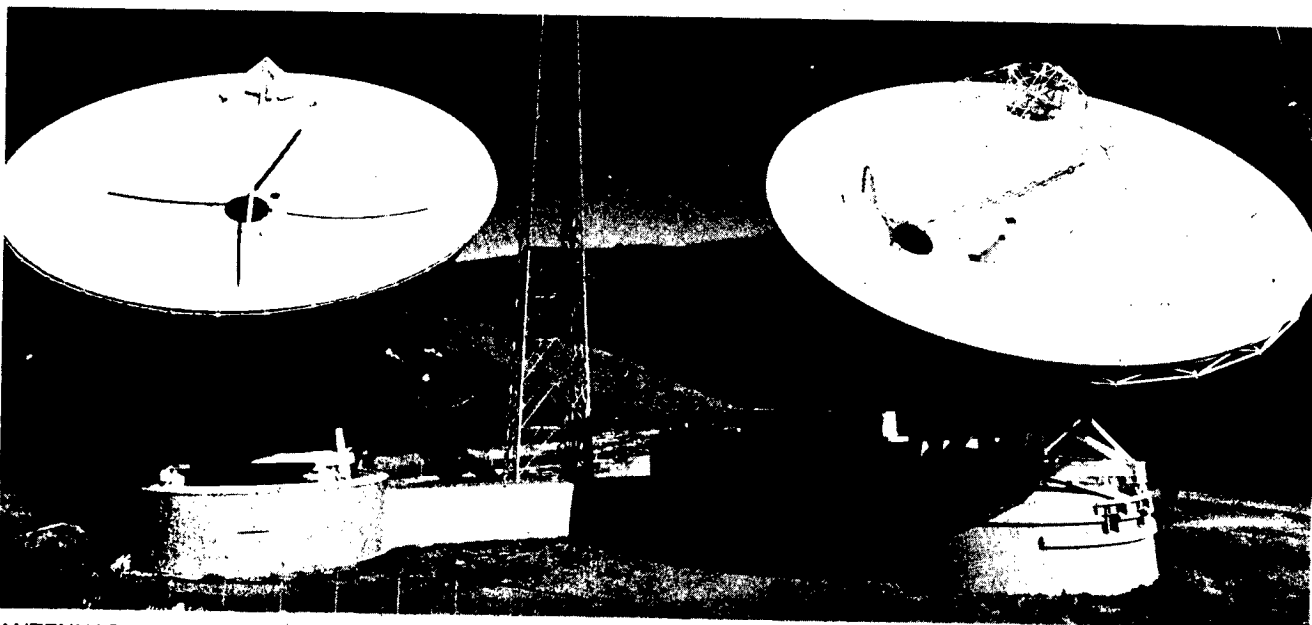
"There is a 750-kilowatt gas turbine generator and enough fuel to run it for 12 days if necessary," he says. "And we have banks of new round-cell batteries which will supply all power needs while the turbine-generator is coming up to full speed."

(In fact the batteries could run the whole operation for more than half an hour, should the diesel unit prove balky on starting.)

The Marin County station and the rest of the new domestic satellite network will augment existing nationwide coaxial cable and microwave facilities, increasing the phone system's reliability and flexibility.

The domestic satellites are another advance stemming from Telstar, the first communications satellite, which went aloft in 1962.

Giant antennas will relay phone messages



ANTENNAS nearly 100 feet in diameter will beam telephone messages to a satellite from new "earth station" in Marin County.

SOMETIME SOON, probably this month, a rocket will soar skyward from Cape Kennedy in Florida with a 1,460-pound satellite tucked into its nose cone. The satellite will be popped into orbit 22,300 miles into space.

After mid-year, your long-distance telephone calls may well go by way of this satellite, called Comstar I.

Calls will be sent up to Comstar by a big dish antenna recently completed in Marin County. The satellite will relay the calls back from space to similar antennas at any of six other earth stations like the one in Marin.

By next spring Comstars II and III will also be in orbit and a full network of three satellites plus the seven

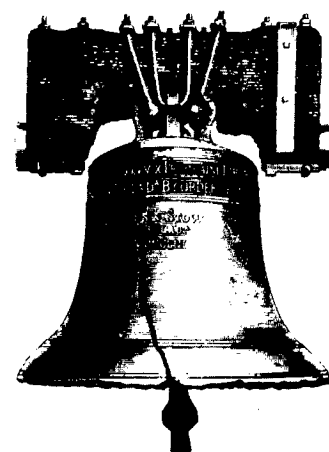
earth stations in the continental United States and Hawaii will be in operation. The network will be able to handle up to 28,800 simultaneous telephone conversations.

This, the first purely domestic satellite telephone network, is a joint project of American Telephone and Telegraph Co. and General Satellite Corporation (GSAT). AT&T will own four earth stations, GSAT three.

The AT&T station in Marin County is striking in appearance.

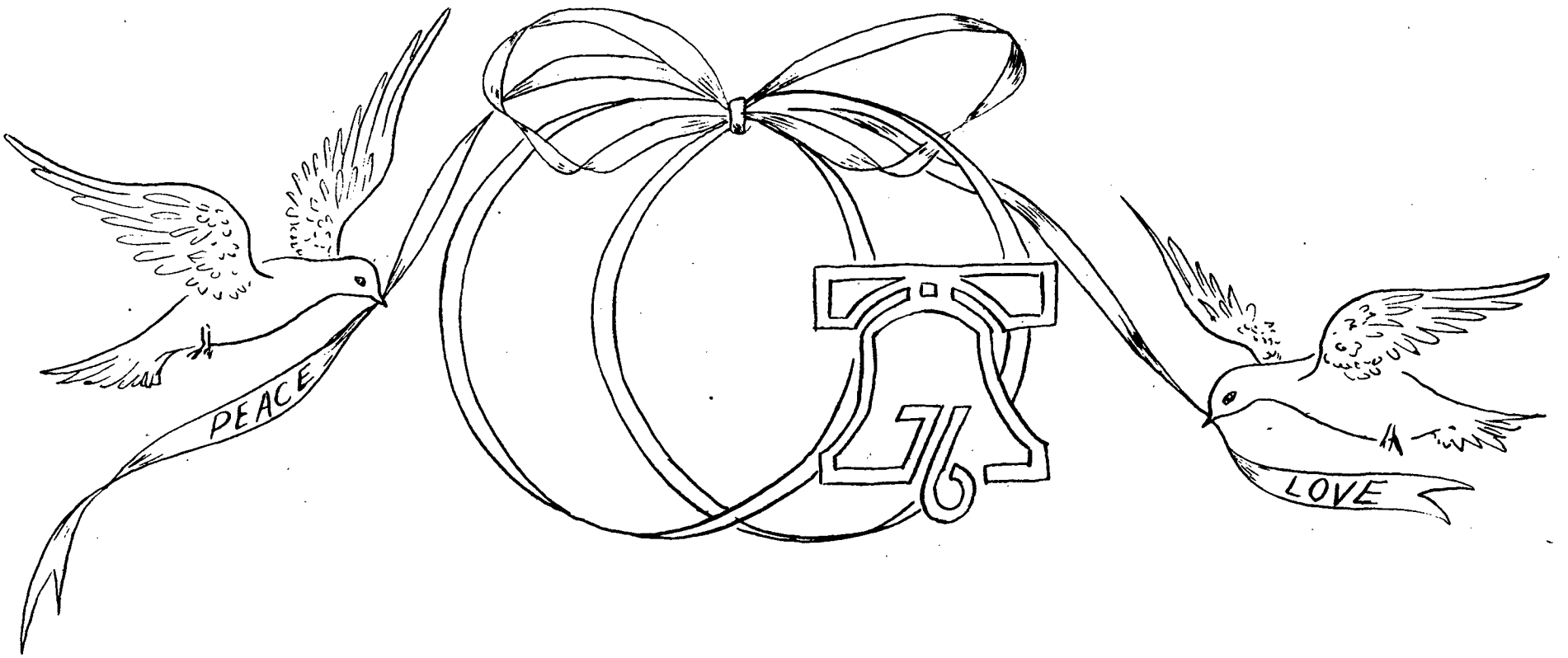
Two massive but delicately balanced antennas dominate a small natural bowl in the hills, but are not visible from outside it.

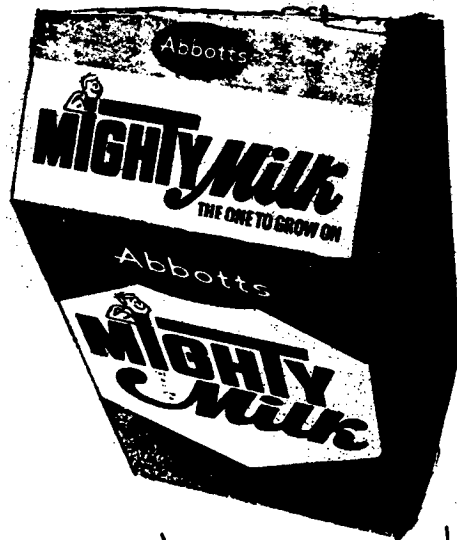

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101-Year-Old's Secret for Long Life:

LOW BLOWS KNOCK YOU DOWN**

"Life has a way of throwing a low blow every
now and then—but when it knocks you down,
don't let it keep you down!"

That's New England painter John Caughey's
simple secret for longevity, and he's living proof
it works. He's 101 years old—and still going
strong.

When his studio burned down last spring,
Caughey took the blow in stride and rebuilt it
with his own two weathered hands. He says
that's how he's always handled his problems—
head-on.

"I never give up on life or anything else.

"I don't have time to die. I've always looked
forward, was never satisfied to wait for what
was coming. Most people never know what's
around the next corner—but I like to run ahead,
take a peek, and be ready for any challenge."

Caughey's century-plus-one has been chock-
full of activity. For 60 years he worked as a
stone mason, building bridges and buildings all
over New England. He retired at 86, but was
bored—so at 92 he became a full-time painter.

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The ex-mason's bright, true-to-life paintings—
some depicting covered bridges he helped build—
were snapped up by visitors to the studio he built.

But last spring, fire turned his studio and doz-
ens of his favorite paintings to ashes. "That's
10 years down the drain," Caughey said dejected-
ly as he watched firemen douse the smoking em-
bers.

Then his eyes grew bright with determination
and he added: "But I'll start all over again!"

The very next morning Caughey drew plans
for a new studio, and only a few days later it
began going up near the ruins of his old one.
Neighbors were astonished to see the 101-year-
old man doing such strenuous work.

"He was right over there working every day,"
said Caughey's son, John Jr., who helped him
build the studio. "He'd bring his old hammer,
and he'd nail boards and carry stuff. He was
always busy."

The studio was finished by early summer, and
Caughey went back to doing what he loves best,
getting up at dawn and painting until late at
night.

"You've got to keep alert and active," he said,
as he touched up an outdoor scene on his easel.
"You need a tremendous will to tackle some of
the things that have to be tackled, but the re-
wards are worth all the effort."

CANADA PLANS TO CUT ANOTHER BRITISH TIE

Ottawa — Canada is planning legislation to end
its status as the last self-governing nation in the
British Commonwealth not to control its own
constitution.

Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau planned to pre-
sent a legislative proposal to bring home from the
British Parliament the power to amend all aspects
of the Canadian constitution, the British North
America Act.

In his proposal, Trudeau suggested that pro-
visions protecting the rights of Canada's French-
speaking minority be included in the constitution
but said this proposal had been made at the re-
quest of the French-speaking province of Quebec
and had not received his complete endorsement.

Other constitutional changes proposed for dis-
cussion would give the Supreme Court constitu-
tional immunity from federal government inter-
ference and recognize the principle that rich
provinces must aid poorer ones.

POSTAL SERVICE BLUNDER LETS CHEATS ERASE CANCELLATION MARKS & USE STAMPS AGAIN

Some enterprising Americans have come up with a brand new way to cheat the U. S. Postal Service (USPS)—they're erasing the cancellation marks off 13-cent postage stamps and reusing them to mail letters.

This swindle was made possible by another colossal blunder by the USPS. This time they printed a stamp so impregnable that the ink used in the cancellation machine fails to penetrate. Thus, all a cheat has to do is rub the marks with a pencil eraser and, presto, a brand new stamp.

"Erasing doesn't work on every 13-cent stamp," said Patricia Grist of the USPS in Washington, D.C., explaining that the USPS puts phosphorus on all stamps to enable special machines to locate and cancel them.

"But the ink used in the cancellation machines isn't aggressive enough to penetrate the phosphorus on some stamps and that's why the cancellation marks can be easily erased."

Miss Grist said the Post Office can't even speculate on how much money is being lost because of stamps being reused.

Now, however, it looks like the cheaters are out of luck—the USPS has come up with a solution to their problem.

"We've developed a new ink for stamp canceling that can't be erased," Miss Grist said. "When the new ink has been distributed, the practice of erasing cancellation marks will end."

AN ERA PASSES

The glamour age of astronauts has passed, and according to Lee R. Scherer, director of the Kennedy Space Center at Cape Canaveral, Fla., "We should never anticipate it again."

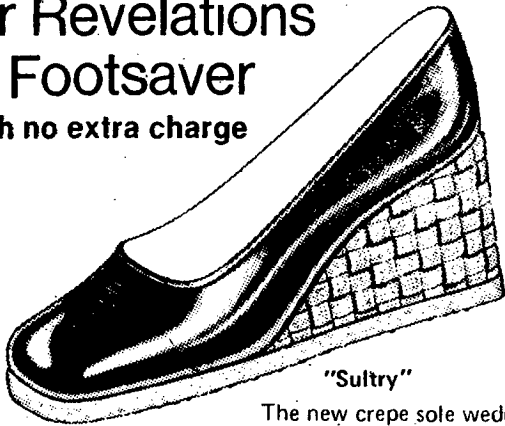
This year, for the third time since Alan Shepard was launched into space in 1961, America's manned program will be grounded.

No astronauts will return to space until the first manned shuttle is launched in March, 1979. The shuttle will then transport not only men to and from space, but also an assortment of satellites.

Between now and 1979, the space agency will work with the two nuclear solar-powered Viking robots which were launched to Mars last summer to dig out, photograph and study the Martian surface and environment. NASA will launch some 20 satellites this year, but no men.

The last Americans who flew in space were Thomas Stafford, Vance Brand, and Donald "Deke" Slayton. In July, 1975, they met two Russian cosmonauts in orbit. That mission spelled the finish of the giant Saturn rockets and their Apollo spaceships. The days of Apollo are gone. In the 1960's, when the moon program was in full bloom, the Kennedy Space Center employed 26,000 people. Now it employs 7,000.

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BONN VOTES EQUAL RIGHTS FOR WIVES

Bonn—The West German parliament has passed a law that grants women equal rights in marriage and allows uncontested divorces after a one-year separation.

The opposition-controlled Bundesrat, the upper house of parliament which at first rejected the bill, approved an amended version which the lower house had passed. Most of the reforms take effect next year.

Besides granting women equal rights in marriage, the new law allows newlyweds the option of adopting the bride's last name, guarantees that divorced couples share pensions equally and eliminates blame from divorce proceedings.

The German hausfrau now can take a job outside the home no matter how her husband feels about it. Under the old law, dating back to Kaiser Wilhelm II, a husband could divorce his wife if she got a job without his permission.

EISENHOWER MOUNTAIN KEEPS NAME AWHILE

Edmonton, Alta.—The Historical Society of Alberta says it won't change the name of Eisenhower Mountain in Banff National Park back to Castle Mountain before 1977, to avoid offending the United States during the neighbor's Bicentennial.

Alan Ridge, Alberta's archivist and a member of the society, said officials are moving cautiously on the matter so as not to appear "jingoistic and anti-American."

He said the society was informed at its annual meeting earlier this year that federal and provincial governments had approved the name change proposed by the society in 1975.

2 HOTEL FLOORS SET FOR NONSMOKERS

Atlanta—Two floors of the Hyatt Regency Hotel here have been set aside for nonsmokers.

General Manager Darryl Hartley-Leonard said if the experiment is a success other hotels in the Hyatt Regency chain will adopt the concept.

The change was in response to a Georgia law passed last year that restricts public smoking.

"We would rather do something positive ahead of time than wait for legislation to be enacted in our industry," Hartley-Leonard said.

U. S. BUDGET DEFICIT IS \$962 FOR EACH FAMILY

Each family's share of the current federal budget deficit is a whopping \$962, according to a U.S. Chamber of Commerce estimate. That could rise to \$1,500 if all major Congressional bills now pending become law, it said.

However, the chamber noted, these figures pale in comparison with each family's share of total government outlays for the year — an astronomical \$5,133.

HALF OF ALL 2-YEAR-OLDS HAVE AT LEAST 1 CAVITY

More than 50 percent of all 2-year-olds in America have at least one cavity, says Dr. John Tabak, president of the American Society of Dentistry for Children.

"Studies prove the majority of orthodontist work is the result of the premature loss of first teeth. The first teeth are important to the development of the jawbone, facial features and play a critical role in speech and chewing."

Dr. Tabak recommends that parents have their children's teeth examined no later than 3 years old.

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Communications Expert Warns...

TV WILL RULE OUR LIVES IN THE FUTURE



Television will one day rule every facet of our lives.

That's the grim forecast of communications expert Erik Barnouw, who warns:

"There's a grave danger television will eventually take over most everything — education, business, entertainment and even politics."

If that happens, people will lose their ability to cope with real life, said Barnouw, professor emeritus of dramatic arts at Columbia University.

"With advances in the science of telecommunications, we run the risk of reaching the stage where we'll seldom have to leave home.

"A child's entire education will come from a TV screen and adults will conduct business 'face-to-face' from their homes. The business office as we know it will be obsolete."

Barnouw, a former TV writer and producer, believes even the political system will undergo drastic changes.

"A politician could conduct an instant opinion poll by posing a question to viewers who respond by pushing a button on their TV sets. It doesn't take much imagination to foresee the day when the so-called opinion poll becomes a vote in the electoral process.

"When this stage is reached, the human race is in trouble.

"Our homes will become electronic cocoons. Citizens of tomorrow will suffer many psychological problems because they'll rely on television for everything and be isolated from reality."

Although this startling scenario is a long way off, the problem has already begun to develop, Barnouw warned, adding that television has made a dramatic impact on children.

"We're well aware of how violent programs make children more violent but what isn't so well known is the effect that softer TV programs have on children.

"Instead of going to nursery or day school, preschoolers watch hours and hours of television rather than playing with friends.

"Children are being conditioned to accept a secondhand experience of life.

"We still have the ability to switch off our sets — let's use that ability."

The tax bite on the average American family has nearly doubled in the past 10 years.

In 1977, that figure will be \$5,328 — an increase of 99 percent, the Chamber estimates.

The Newspaper Advertising Bureau polled thousands of families about their reading of the classified columns. Seven out of ten families responded that they read the classifieds. What

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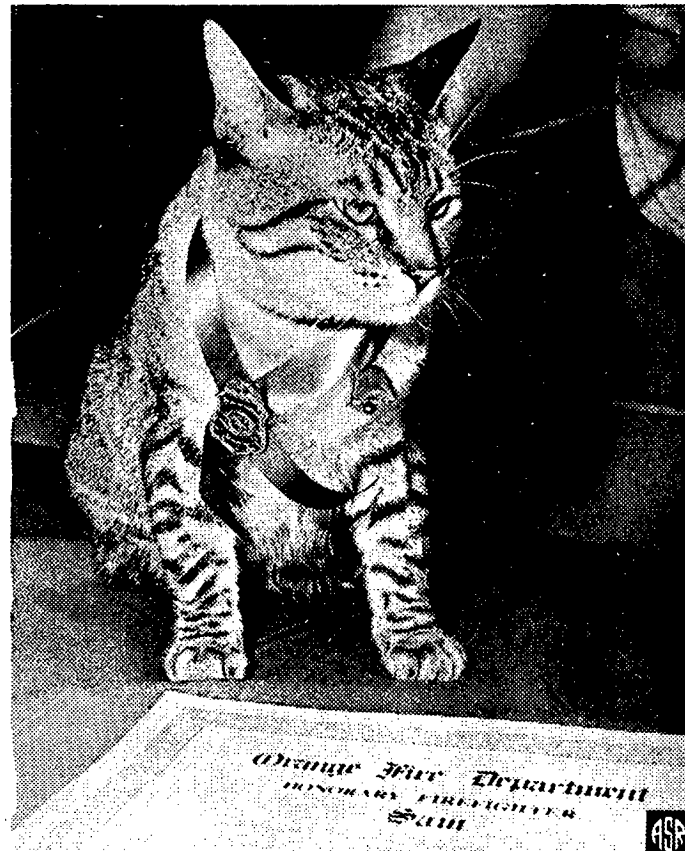

Jim Hutton, star of "El-lery Queen", has greatly increased the sales of crushable Irish walking hats—particularly in British tweed fabrics.

Robert Blake, star of "Baretta," has had a favorable effect on men's attitudes toward the 8-section Gatsby cap with peak visor, and Wayne Rogers of "City of Angels" is helping the fedora stage a comeback.

Crediting the boom to younger men, Headwear Institute President Sol Bernstein said, "Twenty years ago, the youth market was the first group lost by the headwear industry."

"It's ironic that the same category responsible for the industry's original downturn is currently acting as a catalyst to increased sales."



**BEN FRANKLIN UPSET; LOSING
POST OFFICE**

Ben Franklin, Tex.—The U.S. Postal Service is planning to close the post office here, but residents say it just wouldn't be right to lose the Ben Franklin postmark during the Bicentennial year.

It was Benjamin Franklin, they note, who as postmaster general for the colonies made the mails self-supporting, speedy and safe.

The Postal Service is considering closing the post office in this small north Texas town.

CUTTERS TO PATROL 200-MILE LIMIT
Washington—Coast Guard Commandant Adm. Owen W. Siler said he expects no confrontations with other nations over enforcement of the new U.S. 200-mile fisheries limit.

Siler, at a news conference, said the service expected to spend some \$24 million annually for enforcement operations, which will start next March 1 under the bill signed into law by President Ford.

Siler said three cutters would be taken out of mothballs to help patrol the vastly expanded U.S. fishing grounds and that additional money probably would have to be provided by Congress for added equipment "to do the job more completely."

Foreign fisherman will have to pay fees.

Appearing with Siler was Dr. Robert M. White, administrator of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, which plays a role in the management of the expanded fisheries.

White said U.S. fishing stocks "are in bad shape in many cases," and that the task ahead would be immense and complicated. Aides to White said it would be possible that some species could be revived for commercial harvesting in as little as three years.

The new law bans fishing by foreign fleets unless given specific permission.

Regional management councils will develop fishery management plans, determine which species can be taken and in what amounts. If there is to be a harvest, U. S. fishermen will get the first crack.

STANDARDIZED ENVELOPE
SIZES URGED

Washington—The Postal Rate Commission recommended letter envelope sizes be standardized so the Postal Service can sort and route them by machine at less cost.

If the regulations are adopted, mailers would have to pay a surcharge for oversize envelopes. Undersize envelopes would be banned.

The Postal Service has sought standardized sizes since 1973 because letters cost more to handle if they are too big or too small for its processing equipment.

The commission, an independent agency Congress set up to rule on postal rates and other policies, said its recommendations are a first step toward basic mail classification reform.

The commission submitted the recommendations to the Postal Service board of governors. If the board approved, the regulations would go into effect two years later, giving envelope manufacturers time to comply.

The proposed rules would apply to first class and air mail and to some third class mail which fails to meet present size and shape regulations, the commission said.

The commission recommended other cost-cutting procedures such as giving discounts to encourage big mailers to presort their first class and air mail letters, making it cheaper for the Postal Service to handle them.

Many big mailers do that at present in order to get faster delivery but do not get other compensation.

The commission decided allowance should be made for the work mailers perform that saves costs for the Postal Service. The cooperating mailer would be charged one cent less per piece.

The commission also recommended a two-part price structure for business reply mail, a simpler bulk rate for parcel post, changes in special rates for certain fourth class mail and changes in special rates for catalogs.

For business reply mail, the commission proposed a fee of 3.5 per piece for users who deposit a \$75 annual fee in advance and 12 cents per piece for mailers who do not make advance deposits.

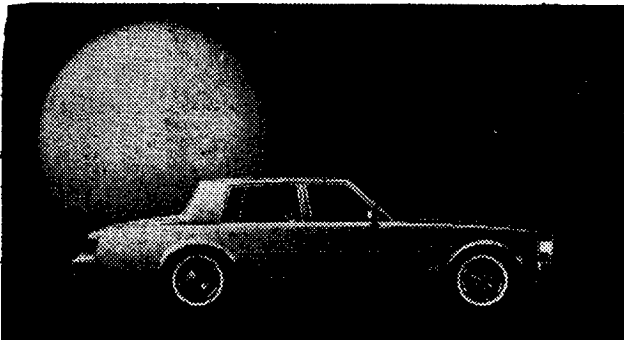
For parcel post, the commission would allow bulk mailers to pay postage on the average weight of the pieces for each mail zone rather than requiring them to weight and calculate the postage on each piece.

ANTS USE TOOLS AS FOOD BUGGY

Washington — Four species of ants have been observed using pieces of leaves, dry mud and grains of sand to transport food to their colonies over long distances, according to a report in Science journal.

Joan and Gary Fellers, both graduate students at the University of Maryland, said this

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may be the first known case of tool use by a social insect.

They said by using the "tools," the ants increased significantly the amount of soft food or liquid they could carry back to the nest. Otherwise, the ants normally would carry such food internally.

CLOSURE ORDER DUE FOR BOSTON TOWER

Boston—Boston's building commissioner, Francis Gens, says he plans to order everyone out of the 60-story John Hancock building unless he gets a good explanation for a new wave of falling glass.

Gens asked for reports recently on six windows that have fallen from New England's tallest building since 10,000 panes were replaced.

The latest break aroused fears that air pressure might suck someone out of the building, Gens said, but he is allowing 374 John Hancock employees to stay temporarily because they are "in no real immediate danger."

JUDGE WITH HEART

A Mexican man was held in Tucson, Ariz., on charges he transported 1,200 pounds of marijuana. The man Antonio Santiago, told the court

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he engineered the deal to raise money to pay for open-heart surgery for his infant daughter. So Superior Court Judge Jack G. Marks, who underwent the same operation five years ago, said he'd pay for the baby's operation. "We're human beings first and judges second," Marks said. He delayed sentencing on Santiago's guilty plea.

TIDAL WAVE PROPHECY

Miami—Scores of Miami Latins have abandoned their possessions, packed their families and have fled the city, fearful of a woman's prophecy that a tidal wave will engulf Florida sometime this month.

"We've left behind business, good homes, everything," said Norka Feijoo, an evangelist pastor who said all members of her congregation "have moved from Miami—some to Puerto Rico, Virginia and Atlanta."

BASEBALL WILL GET OVER \$50 MILLION
FROM TV AND RADIO THIS YEAR

The major league baseball clubs will receive \$50,820,000 from television and radio broadcasters for the right to cover their games this year. That's a cool \$6.6 million more than they got last year, according to Broadcasting magazine.

Of the 1976 total, \$27,545,000 will be paid to individual ball clubs by local and regional broadcasters, \$23.2 million will be paid to the major leagues by ABC-TV and NBC-TV, and \$75,000 will be paid to the leagues by CBS Radio.

Offered Invention for \$100,000 . . .

WESTERN UNION REJECTED
BELL'S TELEPHONE BECAUSE
'IT'S A TOY'

"What use could this company make of an electrical toy?" scoffed the president of the Western Union Telegraph Co.—as he turned down the chance to buy Alexander Graham Bell's telephone patents.

William Orton wouldn't risk \$100,000 of the giant monopoly's money on Bell's invention—and lost the chance to build a new communication empire.

Bell came hat-in-hand to Orton a century ago because he desperately needed cash. He'd just obtained his first patents on the talking device and transmitted his famous "Mr. Watson, come here, I want you" message.

But his chief backer was running short of funds and credit, so the decision was reached to sell out. There was only one logical buyer: the giant Western Union Telegraph Co., with assets of \$41 million.

Bell's attorney visited Orton and offered to sell all the phone patents for \$100,000. Orton's answer was a contemptuous NO—he apparently had little respect for Bell as an inventor.

The Scottish-born Bell and his backers dug even deeper into their pockets, and managed to install a few thousand phones by the end of 1879.

Meanwhile, Orton had changed his mind about the telephone—and bought the patent of another scientist. Western Union planned for its subsidiary, the Gold and Stock Telegraph Co., to flood the nation with the new device. But they were too late.

On Sept. 12, 1878, Bell filed suit in Mass., charging an agent of Western Union with infringing on his patents. Attorneys for the conglomerate decided they could not win the case and settled out of court.

The company turned over to Bell 56,000 phones in 55 cities and agreed to get out of the telephone business for good. The final decree, issued on April 4, 1881, guaranteed that the Bell Telephone Co. plus its subsidiaries and affiliates would control the new invention—leaving Orton on the outside of one of the greatest bonanzas in the history of communications.

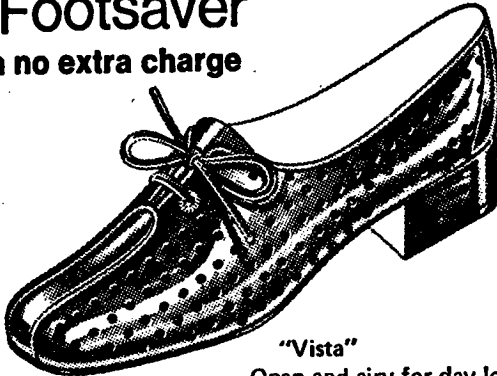
Professor Warns . . .

SPECIAL PROGRAMS FOR EXTRA-BRIGHT
SCHOOL PUPILS CAN DO THEM MORE
HARM THAN GOOD

School "enrichment" programs for extra-bright pupils are a total waste unless the child is skipped to a higher grade, says a Johns Hopkins psychology professor who works with high-I.Q. youngsters.

The enrichment program can even hurt the very bright child by keeping him at boring tasks, said Dr. Julian C. Stanley.

Too often enrichment is just "make-work," he declared. "Imagine having to serve time in first-year algebra for 180 periods of 50 minutes each

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when you know the subject well the first day of class!" he said.

Bright students can suffer intellectually and emotionally unless they are skipped, he added.

By contrast, "we have helped a 6th grade, 11-year-old boy become a fulltime college student. He skipped grades 7 through 12. Two 13-year-old boys entered Johns Hopkins right out of the 8th grade."

STUDY Shows . . .

AMERICANS WASTE HALF THE FUEL
THEY CONSUME

Half the fuel consumed in the United States each year is wasted.

That's the startling conclusion reached by the nonprofit Worldwatch Institute of Washington in a recent study commissioned by the Federal Energy Administration.

"We really must have a new combination of energy sources on line in the next 10 to 15 years at the outside, or we will be in serious trouble," declared Denis Hayes, the study's author.

Hayes, former director of the Illinois State Energy Office and an energy consultant for the Smithsonian Institution, headed a task force that spent a year preparing the Worldwatch report.

Last year, according to the study, the U.S. wasted more fuel than was used by two thirds of the world's population. For example, the study says:

"If all the world's inhabitants were to eat as Americans eat — and farm, process and prepare their food in the American style — the world's food system would require almost 80 percent of the annual world energy budget."

Hayes argues:

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Citing examples of energy waste, the study reports, among other things, that trucks haul less than one fifth of all freight but consume almost one half of all fuel; existing lighting standards in buildings are at least double what's needed; inadequate insulation in homes and offices results in the waste of 80 percent of the energy needed to heat and cool them.

Worldwatch suggests that buildings and even automobiles should be better insulated to save heating and cooling energy.

Greater use should be made of waterway pipelines and railroads to lessen reliance on trucks. And lighting standards should be changed.

"Energy conservation could reduce our vulnerability in foreign affairs and save consumers billions of dollars every year," said Hayes, but he admitted he's not optimistic that the necessary cutbacks will be made.

"Such a reduction is neither inevitable nor even very likely," he stated bluntly in his report. "During the last fuel crisis, pleas for cutbacks were largely ignored."

SPACE-AGE EGGS

The fish eggs that went into space last summer with the Apollo astronauts are developing okay, scientists say. Two anatomy professors at the University of Louisville, in Kentucky, say that 95 percent of the eggs hatched. The eggs were aboard the Apollo capsule that linked with the Russian craft last July.

HIGH SCHOOL DROPOUT BECAME THE WORLD'S HAMBURGER KING

He's the "Big Mac" behind the phenomenal success of the McDonald's hamburger empire, but his name isn't McDonald.

He's a high school dropout named Ray A. Kroc, a living dynamo of a man who's chairman of the board of the \$1 billion-a-year fast-food chain that now spans the globe with more than 3,400 outlets.

Kroc, 74, admits he's been a hustler since he first learned to rub two coins together. "I wanted to be a successful man, of course, and if you want to be successful in America, you've got to make money," he said.

After quitting school at 15 he lied about his age and joined a World War I ambulance corps. After the war he enjoyed a brief career as a ragtime piano player, and later became music director for a Chicago radio station.

Eager to make his fortune, Kroc tried his hand at peddling real estate in Florida. But he went broke during the Florida land bust of the '20s. Back in Chicago, he got into sales work and eventually became exclusive agent for a line of milkshake mixers.

In 1954, the original McDonald's restaurant, run by two brothers in San Bernardino, Calif., ordered enough of Kroc's mixers to make 48 milkshakes at one time. Intrigued, Kroc bought into the restaurant as a partner of the McDonald brothers, Richard and Maurice, who are now retired. He soon transformed the business into a fast-mushrooming corporate giant.

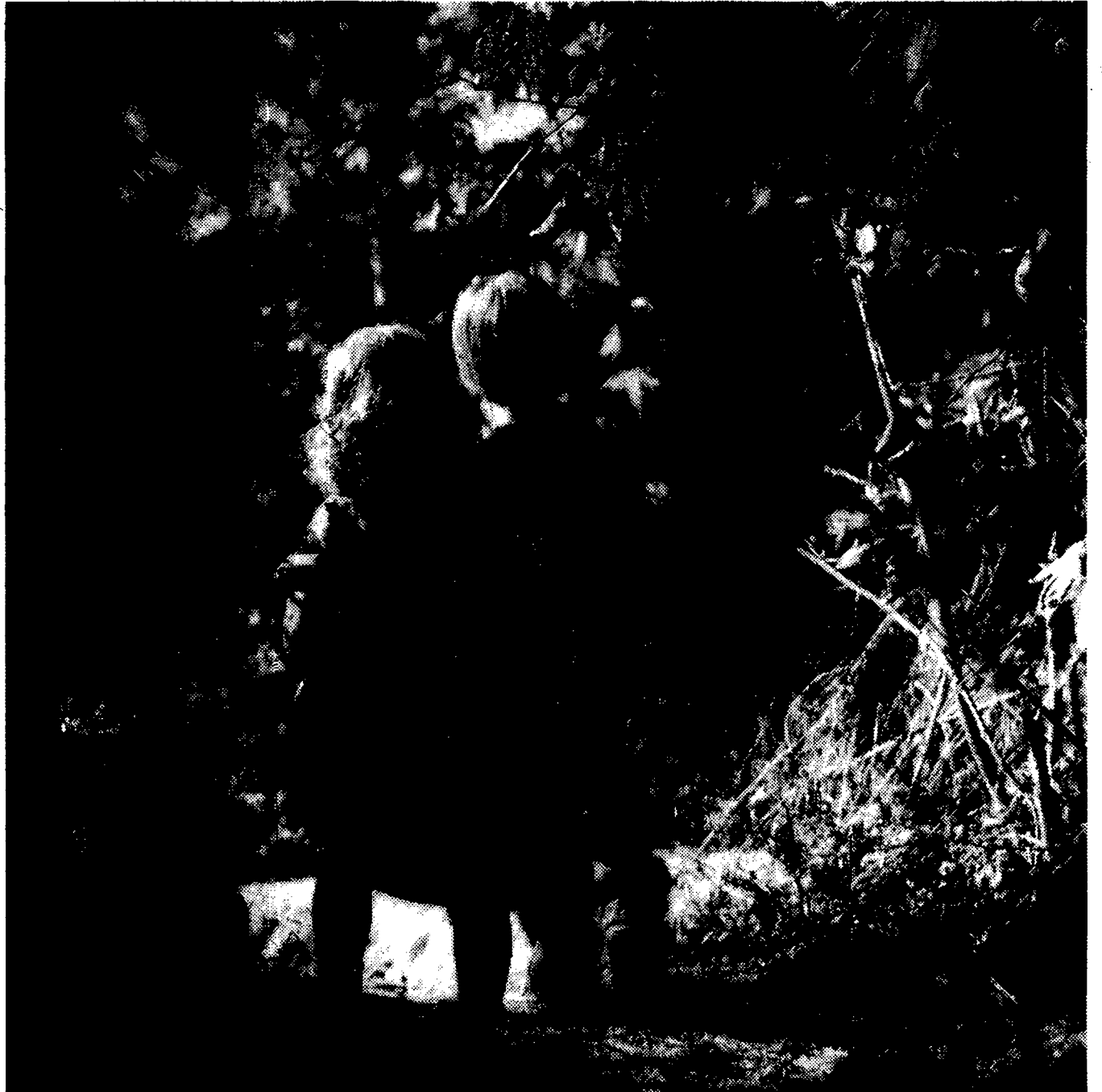
In 1955 Kroc opened the first McDonald's under his own management, in Chicago, selling hamburgers for only 15 cents. Twenty years later, he proudly announced he had sold 16 billion hamburgers—enough to circle the globe 41½ times at the equator.

Explaining the secret of his success, Kroc said, "What we've tried to do is eliminate those things that people don't eat. You can't eat a 20 percent tip, or a perfumed finger bowl. We are in the meat and potatoes business—and meat and potatoes aren't a fad."

Estimated to be worth \$500 million today, Kroc owns a 210-acre ranch in California and a 10,000-square-foot home in Florida with a 72-foot yacht tied up to his dock out front. On his 70th birthday in 1972, he gave \$7.5 million away to hospitals and museums.

"Such a dream could be realized only in America," he said at the time. "My greatest pleasure is to share my good fortune with others."

Kroc has also adopted President Calvin Coolidge's philosophy as his own guideline for living: "Press on. Nothing in the world can take the place of persistence. Talent will not; nothing is more common than unsuccessful men with talent. Education alone will not; the world is full of educated derelicts. Persistence and determination alone are all-powerful."
